

Rental regulations

- 1. No smoking in the unit.
- 2. NO PARTYING! Be a respectful neighbor.

No unregistered guests or parties! Unit neighbors are people enjoying their retirement. Both the property manager and the condominium security can and will evict guests if partying is detected or neighbors complain.

- 3. Take the trash to the community's bins daily.
- 4. No pets allowed without our prior permission.
- 5. If you have health problems or have small children, please be aware of the pool area and stairs leading to the second floor.
- 6. Take care of our property and amenities as you would your own. Please leave no food or beverages out this is Costa Rica, and there are ants!
- 7. All property must remain at the unit when you leave. Damage & missing items will be charged.
- 8. No glassware, open beverage containers or picnics at the pool areas.
- Each person must follow ALL security and HOA association rules/ directives. (HOA/condominium rules posted at the end of this document)
- 10. You are responsible for the parking pass (contingent on a \$100 deposit) & keys. The charge for missing keys, remote, or parking pass is \$100 each!
- 11. We invite you to join us in our efforts to be environmentally friendly by turning off A/Cs whenever you leave the unit. This small act not only helps in conserving energy but also ensures our home remains a sustainable and welcoming space for all. Thank you for your cooperation and understanding.
- 12. Let us know if there are issues or problems with the unit that needs attention immediately. Contact us directly or the property manager.
- 13. You must answer messages from the property manager or us within 24 hours during your stay. Please arrange a check-out time to meet with the property manager at least two days in advance.
- 14. No drug use, illegal activities, or overt drunkenness is allowed on the premises! (Sorry this list is long, we aren't killjoys, but these have become necessary due to bad behavior.)
- 15. Leave the unit mildly clean at the time of check-out. The check-in and check-out time must be fully respected.
- 16. Neither the owner nor the agent is responsible for the loss, theft or damage in the rented unit.
- 17. All our swimming pools are available from 7:00 am to 10:00 pm.

Safe box instructions

- Change of code:
 - 1. With door open, locate the reset button on the back of the door near hinge and press.
 - Input a new 4-digit code, then press (A) button; wait 1 second and input new code again until you see the green light on.
- Close the safe box
- Please leave the safe box open at the moment you check out.
- We are not responsible for items left out in the safe box in case of robbery.

Your Safety

At Coco Sunset Hill gated community, your safety and security are our top priorities. Our community is designed to provide a safe and comfortable environment for all our guests. We have round-the-clock security guards, surveillance cameras, and controlled access to ensure the safety of our residents and visitors. However, we remind all guests to exercise caution and common sense during their stay. We advise against leaving valuable items unattended in the open, and recommend that you keep your doors and windows locked when you leave your unit. It's always better to be safe than sorry, so please do not hesitate to reach out to us if you have any concerns or need assistance.

Cable, Internet & security devices

The cable modem, Internet WiFi router, security sensors Gateway and the UPS for the Internet & Cable are located on and below the office desk and are not to be removed from their dedicated location.


CableTV and remotes

Coco Sunset Hill HOA Rules and regulations

P00LS:

- Pool Hours are from 7:00 am-10:00 pm (07:00-22:00). Any items left at the pool after hours will be removed and discarded.
- No unattended minors in the pool (children 13 and under). Adult supervision is required.
- No running, screaming, jumping, diving, splashing or dangerous activities.
- Shower prior to entering the pool.
- No babies in the pool who are not toilet-trained.
- Do not remove pool furniture.
- No smoking or drug use.
- Absolutely no glass in the pool area, including ranchos. All beverages in the pool area must be in a sealed/resealable and unbreakable container.
- Individuals who are intoxicated will be asked to leave the pool area.
- Remove your trash.
- No animals in the pool.
- No loud music.
- No nudity.
- Currently, there are no Common Area Bathrooms. Please return to your unit to use the bathroom.
- DO NOT 'reserve' chairs & loungers by placing personal articles on them and leaving the pool area. After being vacant for 15 or more minutes, personal effects on 'reserved' chairs and loungers can be removed and placed to the side. We are not responsible for unattended items left at the pool.
- Food is not permitted in the pool or on the pool deck. Food is permitted only in the covered ranchos.
- Current Pool Rules are posted at each pool. Please read & understand prior to pool use.

PETS & ANIMALS:

- You MUST pick up animal waste.
- Stray animals will be removed from the community.
- No unattended pets. Pets shall not be permitted to roam free about the community.
- No pets in the pool.
- No excessive noise/barking.
- Owners are responsible for all damages caused by their pets.
- Pets that interfere with the comfort or safety of other residents will not be permitted in the community.
- Feeding wild animals is strictly forbidden.
- Keeping wild animals as pets is against the law in Costa Rica and will not be tolerated.

Quiet time is from 11:00 pm - 8:00 am. No unit owner shall make or permit any noise that will disturb others or interfere with their use and enjoyment of the property. Security will identify offending units and a fine may be levied against them at the discretion of the Board.

PARKING:

- Parking is permitted only in the Parking Lots. Do not park along the roads, grass, corridors, ranchos, gardens, pathways or any common area not designated for parking, in the community.
- There is no assigned or reserved parking other than the designated charging area for golf carts.
- Golf carts are not to remain parked and/or plugged into the charging station for more than 8 hours. The golf cart charging station is a charging station, not a parking space. Once charged, golf carts are to be removed and parked in a proper space. Golf carts parked in excess of 8 hours in the charging area may be fined and removed.
- Units who are 2+ months delinquent in their payments (which include HOA fees, or any other amount owed to the HOA) will no longer have valid parking passes. Parking rights will be revoked for all units 2 or more months delinquent in their obligations.
- Parking Passes must be properly displayed at all times. Each unit is permitted one Parking Pass and is allowed one temporary guest vehicle. Any vehicle that violates these rules is subject to fines and towing for each offence.
- Golf Cart charging is permitted only in designated areas. Currently there is a charging station in the in the North Lot.
- There is to be no honking of horns to gain access or leave our community. Our guards are not doormen and have been instructed not to open any gates for any party without a key or remote, unless they have been given prior consent. Residents must have keys or remotes.
- The license plate of golf carts, quad cycles, or any vehicle which is not a car must register their license plate with the property manager. No unit can use more than one parking space.

ACCESS FOR OWNERS & GUESTS

- If you have guests coming to visit, it is recommended you contact security **8755-8357** and notify them. They will be required to show ID.
- Guests walking, or in vehicles, approaching the gate will be required to provide identification to security, identify the unit they are visiting and the name of the owner/resident.
- Owners/Residents who have been locked out accidentally will be required to provide ID and their unit number if they are not known by security. If their ID is in their unit, they will be accompanied to the unit to provide to security.

SECURITY GUARDS:

- Security Guards are here to help maintain the safety and enjoyment of our community. Everyone must respect the Security Guards and follow their direction. Residents who treat guards in a discourteous manner will be subject to further investigation and fines will be imposed against their unit.
- The Security Guards are instructed to call the Police for any continued violation of the Rules and Regulations.

• Any concerns or problems regarding the Security Guards shall be directed to the property manager. (propertymanagement@grupomapache.com).

GARBAGE & RECYCLING:

- Trash/Garbage shall be placed in the trash collection facilities. Currently, there is a bin located in the far south end of the main parking lot, one near the security station and one at the north corner of the north parking lot.
- Trash/Garbage may not be placed anywhere else outside of the unit.
- Recycling facilities, if present, are for properly sorted recycling materials only.
- Residents who place trash in the recycling bins will receive a warning and sorting costs and fines may be imposed against their unit if deemed appropriate by the Board.

COMMON AREAS & VISIBLE AREAS:

- Respect Common Areas at all times.
- Do not remove furniture
- No smoking
- No cooking in Common Areas except as the provided BBQ/Grills. No personal BBQ/Grill permitted in Common Areas.
- No loud music
- No nudity
- No decorative pieces, plants, fountains, statues, wall hangings, décor or structures are to be
 placed in any common area without explicit consent of the Board. Terraces, balconies and
 patios, which are owned by the individual units, may be decorated as long as the items do
 not interfere with the general characteristics and aesthetic harmony of the community
 image.
- Balconies and windows are not to have items which disrupt the image of our community. This includes flags in windows, laundry on railings or clothes lines visible from outside, bright lights which emit from units, or balconies and other changes which disrupt others. The Board will review and respond to complaints from residents and determine appropriate action.
- Do not hang towels, bathing suits or other items on any balconies, patios, stairs, common areas and plants or railings.
- No personal property is to be stored in any common areas.
- Bicycles must be placed only in designated areas.
- No unauthorized use of common areas is permitted.
- For the safety of residents, NO drones are permitted to fly within the community, exceptions can be made for marketing reasons upon prior request to the BOD.






Ponderosa Adventure Park




